Terminal Box: Smaller, compact enclosures with fewer ports (typically 1-12), focused on protecting the final splice or connector and providing easy access for maintenance.

Distribution Box: Functions as an intermediate node in the network hierarchy, redistributing fibers from feeder lines to multiple drop lines.
