

Broadband Aggregation of Core Switches

Core and Aggregation Switch Roles

Core switches act as the backbone of a network, handling massive volumes of traffic with ultra-low latency and high reliability. They interconnect aggregation or distribution switches and provide high-speed data transfer across network segments, supporting Layer 3 routing, modular scalability, and redundancy features like dual power supplies and hot-swappable modules (Cisco Nexus, Juniper QFX, Huawei CloudEngine).

Aggregation switches sit between access switches and core switches, consolidating traffic from multiple access points. They often provide VLAN segmentation, Layer 3 management, and network isolation, ensuring that traffic is efficiently forwarded to the core layer. Aggregation switches typically connect to access switches via multiple 10/100/1000 Mbps ports and to core switches via high-speed uplinks (1G, 10G, or higher).

Link Aggregation Techniques

Switch aggregation, also called link aggregation or trunking, is the process of combining multiple physical links between switches to function as a single logical link. This provides several benefits:

- Increased Bandwidth:** Aggregating multiple links boosts total throughput beyond a single connection.
- Redundancy and Resilience:** If one link fails, traffic automatically reroutes over remaining links, maintaining uptime.
- Load Balancing:** Traffic is distributed across all aggregated links, preventing bottlenecks.
- Simplified Management:** Aggregated links can be managed as a single entity, reducing administrative overhead.

Common protocols for aggregation include LACP (Link Aggregation Control Protocol) and Virtual Port Channel (VPC), which allow Layer 2 traffic to span multiple switches while maintaining redundancy and failover capabilities.
