This is especially important in industrial installations where both systems carry significant electrical loads. Accessibility and Maintenance: Open cable trays allow easier access for adding or replacing cables, whereas conduits require pulling cables through enclosed spaces. Avoiding blockage ensures that future maintenance or expansion can be performed efficiently .
