Diameter and Fill Considerations The cable diameter directly affects tray selection. Engineers calculate the total cross-sectional area of all cables and apply a fill ratio, typically 50% for power and lighting circuits, to ensure adequate spacing for heat dissipation. Control and instrumentation cables may allow higher fill ratios. Small-diameter flexible cables often use ventilated or solid trays, while larger, rigid cables are routed in ladder trays with appropriate rung spacing (150 mm, 225 mm, or 300 mm) to support the cable weight.

Tray Type and Diameter Variation

- Ladder Trays: Suitable for large-diameter power or control cables; rung spacing varies to support cable weight and maintain airflow.
- Ventilated Trays: Ideal for small-diameter cables; allow heat dissipation and continuous support.
- Solid Bottom Trays: Used for sensitive or small cables requiring full support and protection from debris.

- Reserve 25–40% spare capacity for future cable additions.
- Match tray width to cable bundle diameter rather than just the number of cables.
