Overview

According to NEC Article 250, both the neutral and ground wires must be connected only in the main panel or at the first service disconnect. A neutral link is used to distribute a neutral supply to all the output loads. They should never be connected together downstream of the service equipment, such as in subpanels or other parts of the circuits. A piece of copper is visible that is designed to be easily connected or disconnected from its place between two screws for testing purposes, rated for 600 A (as stamped on it). This serves as the primary source of electrical energy from the mains supply. The lighting and socket circuits generally use. Distribution Board or DB is an electricity supply system or a common enclosure that distributes the electrical power feed into subcircuits. It includes isolator, RCCB (Residual current circuit breaker) or RCD (Residual-current device) devices, protective fuses or MCB's (Miniature Circuit Breaker).

Stray voltages created in grounding (earthing) conductors by currents flowing in the supply utility neutral conductors can be troublesome. For example, special measures may be required in barns used for milking dairy cattle. Very small voltages, not usually perceptible to humans, may cause low milk yield, or even mastitis (inflammation of the udder). So-called "tingle voltage filters" may be required in the electrical distribution system for a milking parlour.

A neutral link is used to distribute a neutral supply to all the output loads. When single-pole MCBs are used for output loads, the neutral wire of the loads is connected to the neutral link.

The Phase and Neutral supply lines (230V AC 50Hz/60Hz) are fed to the DB through the service drop running from the utility pole. It is then connected to the energy meter through a fuse.
