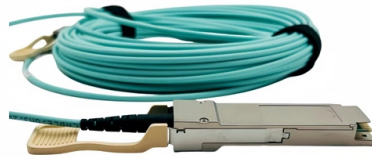


Do cables need cable trays if they are run through conduit corridors
