- Environmental Heat:** Ambient temperatures in attics or enclosed boxes can add to wire heating. Research shows that wires in attics can reach up to 194°F if conditions are extreme, though this is near the insulation limit and not typical for a properly loaded lighting box (Interior Designy).

**Safety Standards** Wires are rated for specific temperatures, commonly 60°C, 75°C, or 90°C, depending on insulation type. Using wires and terminals that meet national electrical safety standards ensures that even under normal load, the wiring remains safe and does not overheat (Grandelectrics). Circuit breakers are also designed to trip if the current exceeds safe limits, preventing dan...
