- Inspection:** Check the clamp and cable for damage and ensure the clamp size matches the cable diameter.
- Mounting Bracket:** Securely attach the pole bracket or hook to the utility pole using stainless steel bands or bolts.
- Clamp Placement:** Open the clamp's wedge system, insert the cable carefully, and avoid twisting or sharp bends.
- Tensioning:** Pull the cable gently to achieve the required tension. The clamp automatically grips the cable firmly.
- Attachment:** Connect the clamp to the pole bracket and ensure all connections are stable.
- Final Inspection:** Verify alignment, tension, and secure attachment to prevent future maintenance issues.

- Maintain a minimum of 18 feet clearance above roads and 40 inches from energized conductors.
