Cleaning Methods

- Dry Cleaning**
 - Lint-free wipes: Used to wipe the ferrule end-face directly, often with a holder to prevent recontamination.
 - Disposable stick-type cleaners: Swabs with lint-free tips for cleaning connectors in adapters or panels.
 - Cartridge-type cleaners: Hand-held devices with a tape reel that exposes a clean section for each use, ideal for repeated cleaning.
- Wet-to-Dry Cleaning**
 - Isopropyl alcohol (99% reagent grade): Applied to lint-free pads to remove oils and residues, followed by a dry wipe to ensure no moisture remains.
 - Avoid cotton swabs or low-grade alcohol: These can leave fibers or damage epoxy.
- Specialized Tools**
 - One-click multi-fiber cleaners: For MTP/MPO connectors, cleaning multiple fibers simultaneously.
 - Ultra-fine stick cleaners: For hard-to-reach adapters or installed connectors, compatible with LC, SC, FC, ST, and MU connectors.
