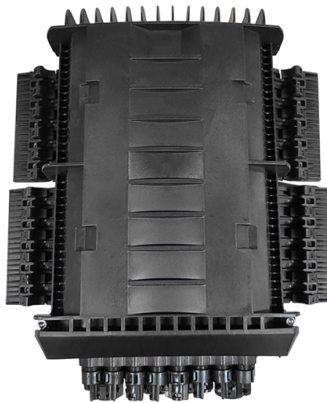


How to thread cables through a ladder-type cable tray

Avoid crossing cables unnecessarily, as this can create tension points and complicate future maintenance. Use pulling grips or fish tape for longer or heavier cables to guide them through the tray without excessive force.

Securing and Finalizing Once cables are in place, secure them at intervals using cable ties or clamps to prevent movement and maintain neatness. Ensure that the tray is not overloaded and that the total cable weight does not exceed the tray's rated capacity. Check that all cables maintain pr...
