

LPO aggregation switch for campus network



AI Overview

An LPO aggregation switch consolidates traffic from multiple access switches, providing high-bandwidth, redundant, and scalable connectivity between the access and core layers of a campus network.

Role of Aggregation Switches

Aggregation switches sit between the access layer (edge switches, wireless APs) and the core layer in a campus network, consolidating traffic and forwarding it efficiently to the core or data center. They operate at Layer 2 or Layer 3, supporting routing, VLAN segmentation, and policy enforcement. By using Link Aggregation (LACP or static), multiple physical links can be combined into a single logical connection, enhancing bandwidth, redundancy, and failover in case of link failure.

Key Features for Campus Deployment

- High Throughput:** Aggregation switches should support high-speed uplinks (10G, 25G, 40G, or 100G) to handle aggregated traffic from multiple access switches.
- Redundancy and High Availability:** Features like MC-LAG or stacking allow multiple switches to act as a single logical unit, providing resiliency and continuous network operation.
- Layer 3 Capabilities:** Routing between VLANs, policy enforcement, and inter-VLAN communication are often handled at the aggregation layer.
- Scalability:** Stackable switches or modular designs allow future expansion without major network redesign.
- Management and Monitoring:** Centralized dashboards (e.g., Meraki or UniFi) simplify configuration, firmware updates, and monitoring of aggregated links.

Best Practices

- Redundant Links:** Use dual aggregation switches with stacking or MC-LAG to ensure failover and maintain gateway availability.
- High-Speed Uplinks:** Connect access switches with 10G or higher links to prevent bottlenecks. For large campuses, consider 40G interconnects between aggregation switches.
- Segmentation and Policy Control:** Implement VLANs and routing policies at the aggregation layer.
