

Must outdoor cable trays be sealed

Environmental Protection For outdoor installations, additional precautions include: Using sunlight-resistant cables to prevent insulation degradation. Installing expansion splice plates to accommodate thermal expansion and contraction. Periodic inspection for rust, moisture accumulation, or UV damage to maintain long-term effectiveness. Ensuring adequate clearance and airflow to prevent overheating, especially in perforated or wire mesh trays.
