

New Jamaican Anti-Cryptoelectronic Cable

Jamaica is set to enhance its digital infrastructure with a new TAM-1 subsea cable, providing up to 20Tbps capacity and improving connectivity, redundancy, and economic opportunities. Overview Jamaica has signed a non-binding letter of intent with Trans Americas Fiber System (TAFS) to extend the TAM-1 (Trans Americas Mesh 1) submarine cable to the island, aiming to strengthen the country's digital infrastructure and resilience . The TAM-1 system, first announced in 2023, spans over 7,000 km, linking Florida with Central America and the wider Caribbean, and is designed for low latency and high-capacity solutions . The Jamaican branch will connect via a purpose-built branching unit, delivering a fiber pair capable of up to 20Tbps . Technical and Financial Details The project is expected to cost between US\$45 million and US\$55 million, depending on the capacity the government acquires . Jamaica currently relies on six submarine cables, many nearing the end of their lifespan, and the TAM-1 extension will provide redundancy and competition, reducing connectivity costs and improving service reliability . The cable will pass approximately 220 km south of Jamaica, with construction anticipated in Q4 2026 and full operation by Q3 2027 . Strategic Importance Prime Minister Andrew Holness emphasized that the project is a strategic investment in Jamaica's technological future, enhancing economic growth, competitiveness, and access to education and employment . Minister Daryl Vaz highlighted that the cable will position Jamaica between key network routes linking North and Latin America, attracting investment and supporting sectors like fintech, BPOs, and digital services . The World Bank is also backing the initiative, recognizing digital infrastructure as critical for modern economic development . Regional Context The Caribbean heavily depends on submarine cables for international connectivity, but many systems are controlled by a single provider, limiting competition .
