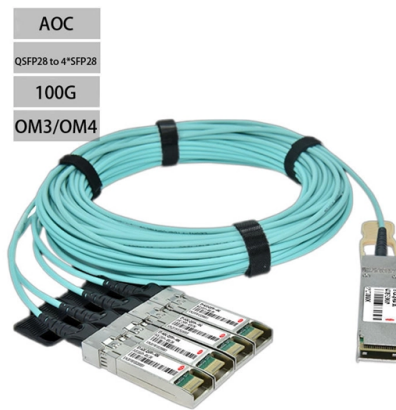


Optimal Distance for Cable Trays

The standard horizontal spacing between parallel cable trays is typically 0.6 meters, with vertical spacing of at least 150 millimeters, and support intervals ranging from 6 to 10 feet for standard trays.

Horizontal Spacing When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the minimum horizontal distance should be 0.6 meters. This spacing ensures adequate maintenance access, proper airflow for heat dissipation, and reduces the risk of cables touching, which could cause short circuits or interference. For power and signal cable trays, a separation of at least 0.5 meters is recommended to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI). If the trays are shielded, this distance can be reduced to 0.3 meters.

Vertical Spacing For floor-mounted or stacked trays, the minimum vertical clearance is 150 millimeters. This allows for ventilation, future expansion, and easier installation of additional trays or cables.

Support Intervals Cable trays must be supported at regular intervals to prevent mechanical strain. Standard trays typically require supports every 6 to 10 feet, while heavy-duty or long-span trays can extend up to 20 feet between supports. Unsupported spans, especially at transitions to equipment, should not exceed 6 feet to avoid undue stress on the cables. Support spacing should also comply with manufacturer specifications and consider the total weight of the cables.

- Clearances above trays:** Maintain at least 12 inches of vertical space for installation and maintenance access.
- Cable type and shielding:** Shielded cables allow closer spacing, while unshielded power and signal cables require greater separation to prevent EMI.
- Compliance with standards:** Follow NEC 392, IEC 61537, and local electrical codes for tray installation, load capacity, and fire safety.

By adhering to these spacing and support guidelines, cable tray installations remain safe, accessible, and efficient, while minimizing risks of overheating, interference, and mechanical damage.
