- Wiring:** Use high-temperature resistant copper wires with cross-sectional areas suitable for the load. Ensure neat cable management, correct wire gauge, and secure connections to terminals.
- Protection devices:** Include circuit breakers, fuses, surge protectors, and leakage protectors for each circuit.
- Grounding and Earthing** All metal parts of the box, electrical boards, and appliances must be properly grounded. Protective neutral wires should be reliably connected through terminal boards to prevent electrical faults.

Compliance and Maintenance Use UL, CE, or CCC-certified components to meet international and national standards. Perform visual inspections and multimeter tests before powering on. Schedule regular maintenanc...
