Color Coding According to NEC and IEC standards, the neutral wire is typically white or gray, while the protective ground is green, bare, or green with a yellow stripe. Live (phase) wires use other colors depending on the system and local regulations. Proper color coding ensures safety and simplifies maintenance.

Wiring Practices Use properly sized conductors for the neutral to handle the expected return current. Ensure tight, secure connections at the neutral bus bar to prevent heat buildup. Verify grounding continuity before energizing the system. Follow torque specifications for all terminals and use comb busbars where possible for multiple connections.
