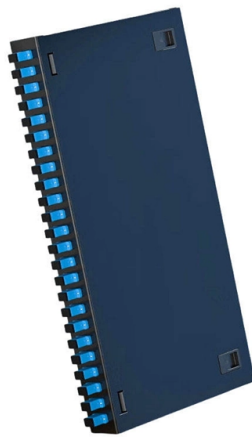


Testing optical attenuation without connecting pigtails



Overview

When it comes to testing fiber optic cables, an Optical Time-Domain Reflectometer (OTDR) is an essential tool. There are two reasons we may want to test bare fiber, by that we mean fiber that has not been terminated in connectors but is simply plain optical fiber. The first one is to ensure the fiber or cable being manufactured meets its specifications, as is done by every manufacturer. An OTDR characterizes the loss of the link for individual splices and connectors by transmitting light pulses into a fiber and measuring the amount of light reflected from each pulse. Three methods exist for measuring it: cutback (the reference standard), insertion loss (the field standard), and OTDR (the diagnostic tool).
