General Wiring Principles

Phase Identification: In a single-phase system, there is one live (phase) wire, a neutral, and an earth. In a three-phase system, there are three live wires (L1, L2, L3), a neutral, and an earth. Each phase must be clearly labeled to avoid confusion during maintenance.

Incoming Supply Connection: Connect the phase and neutral lines from the energy meter to the main isolator (main switch). From the isolator, connect the phase lines to the RCCB and the neutral lines to the neutral link.

MCB and Load Connections: The phase lines from the RCCB are connected in parallel to the MCBs. Each MCB protects a subcircuit. The neutral lines are routed to the neutral link, and the earth lines to the earth bar. For double-pole MCBs, connect both phase and neutral to the load; for single-pole MCBs, connect only the phase to the load, while neutral and earth go to their respective links.

Wire Routing Tips: Keep wires neatly organized and avoid crossing over unnecessarily. Use color-coded wires: typically red/brown for phase, blue for neutral, and green/yellow for earth. Maintain short, direct paths from the terminals to reduce voltage drop and improve safety. Ensure proper insulation and secure connections to prevent loose contacts or short circuits.

Earthing: Connect the earth bar to the earth pit using a proper earth rod. Ensure all metallic parts of the DB and connected devices are properly earthed to prevent electric shock.

Labeling: Clearly label each MCB and phase to indicate the circuit it controls. Proper labeling simplifies maintenance and r...
