

# The spacing requirements for fireproof partitions of cable trays are as follows

- Fire-rated boards and firestop packs for easy installation and good fire resistance.
- Intumescent caulks or putty (e.g., 3M FSP-SLP-M pillows or FSP-MPS moldable putty) that expand under heat to seal gaps.
- Fire-resistant mineral wool or coatings for additional protection and heat dissipation.

**Installation Tips**

- Ensure all gaps inside and around the tray are sealed completely, both internally and externally.
- Use cover plates that are square, consistent in size, and evenly painted to close openings.
- For large openings, install a fire-resistant backing plate before sealing to maintain structural integrity.
- Maintain orderly placement of firestop packs to facilitate inspection and maintenance.

For a 4" x 12" ladder tray, the recommended fireproof partition opening would be 7" x 15", using medium self-locking firestop pillows and two sticks of mold...
