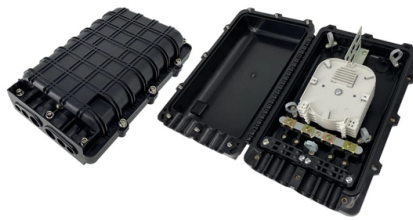

Cable tray cover plates are designed to protect cables, maintain safety, and comply with standards, typically made from hot-dip galvanized steel or stainless steel with precise dimensions and load ratings. Material and Finish Cable tray cover plates are commonly manufactured from hot-dip galvanized steel to prevent corrosion, with all covers and splice plates requiring galvanization after fabrication to ensure durability and safety. Mill-galvanized covers are not acceptable for hot-dip galvanized trays, as post-fabrication galvanization ensures removal of excess zinc and icicles that could damage cables or injure installers. For stainless steel trays, covers are made from AISI Type 304 or 316 stainless steel, matching the tray material for corrosion resistance and structural integrity. Dimensions and Design Cover plates are designed to fit the specific tray type, whether ladder, solid bottom, or channel trays. They must fully cover the tray width and align with side rails to prevent cable exposure. For ladder-type trays, the cover should not interfere with the rung spacing, which is typically 6, 9, or 12 inches on center, and rungs have a minimum cable-bearing surface of 7/8 inch with radiused edges. Solid covers are preferred in applications requiring protection from dust, debris, or electromagnetic interference. Standards and Compliance Cable tray covers must comply with NEMA VE 1 for metallic cable tray systems and relevant ASTM standards for steel and coatings, including ASTM A123, A653, A1011, A1008, and B633. Compliance ensures mechanical strength, electrical safety, and resistance to environmental factors. CE marking or UL certification may also apply depending on regional requirements. Load and Safety Considerations Covers must support the cable load with a safety factor of 1.5 and withstand a 200 lb concentrated load when tested according to NEMA VE 1. Proper i...

Series 1 to 5 Aluminum and Steel
