- Compliance and Standards:** Verify that the cabinet meets local electrical codes, inspection requirements, and industry standards for safety and performance.

Practical Guidelines

- Capacity Planning:** Sum the wattage of all connected devices and infrastructure, then add the growth margin. For example, if your current load is 100 kW, a cabinet rated for 120–130 kW would be appropriate.
- Redundant Feeds:** For critical systems, select cabinets that can handle dual feeds to support continuous o...

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
